Wine and Cheese Night – All are invited to an evening of wine, cheese and fraternity on the <u>11th</u> <u>May at 6.15pm</u>. Tickets are now on sale at the back of the church both in Brewood and Penkridge. The price is £12 a ticket which includes your first glass of wine,(you may purchase another glass/es of wine for a donation) bread, a selection of cheeses, meats, grapes, pate and more. It

will be great to see parishioners from both communities come together for this parish event. Do bring your friends and family too! All money collected will go to the parish.

Reception of Holy Communion – The most important thing about receiving Our Lord in Holy Communion is our interior disposition. This is something that is only between God and ourselves. However the

way we receive externally is also important as it should always communicate and witness to our faith in the real presence of Our Lord – the most precious of gifts. Whatever the circumstances, it's important to always approach the Lord in the most dignified manner possible.

- a) Universally the standard way to receive Holy Communion is **on the tongue**. It reminds us that we aren't eating mere bread but indeed it is Our Lord himself who feeds us like a mother feeds her baby. I would personally encourage Catholics to receive Communion on the tongue because this practice also diminishes the danger of Our Lord falling on the ground and prevents any particles of the Body of Christ from being spread from one hand to the other and so on. When receiving on the tongue it's important, that, after saying "Amen", the communicant opens the mouth and extends the tongue far enough so that the Sacred Host can be placed upon it without the danger of falling.
- b) In the England and in some other countries a permission to receive Communion on the hand was also given and therefore receiving in this manner is also a legitimate option. This has become very prevalent now as, during the pandemic, we were asked to receive this way as a safety precaution. It's however important to do it correctly in the following manner: Extend your hands in the middle of the chest so that the left hand is over the right hand and, in essence, a throne is formed in the sign of an X-cross to receive the Sacred Host. After the Host is then placed on the hand the communicant picks it and places it carefully and reverently in one's mouth. Please do not try to grab the Host 'mid-air'. Likewise please do not move away with the Host before receiving it. Every now and then I need to stop people from carrying the host away (often visiting non-Catholics who simply do not know what to do and copy what the person before them does). This has resulted in a few awkward situations when I had to run after a person and an occasion when the Sacred Host was left in the pews!
- c) If you are holding a baby in your arms and have a walking aid, it makes the reception on the hand particularly difficult so please kindly receive on the tongue.

Annual Mass for Marriage – An invitation is extended to married couples, those celebrating a milestone anniversary and those preparing to marry this year, to our annual Mass for Marriage at St Chad's Cathedral on Saturday 4th May at 12 Noon, followed by light refreshments.
